SCOR Publication Policy

The following preliminary statement of a SCOR Publication Policy was presented by the Publications Officer and adopted at the 31st Executive Committee Meeting (September 1993).

- 1. Each Working Group is expected to produce a publication as a result of its activities.
- 2. In general, SCOR expects that each Working Group will identify the financial support necessary for its own publication.
- 3. Each publication arising from SCOR Working Group activities must carry appropriate acknowledgment of SCOR and, where possible, include the SCOR logo.
- 4. The SCOR Executive Committee should review each Working Group's publication plan at its mid-life point.
- 5. If practicable, a copy of each publication resulting from SCOR-sponsored activities should be distributed to each Committee for SCOR.
- 6. When SCOR subsidizes a publication, the distribution of SCOR copies should be restricted to a mailing list of the Committees for SCOR and the Executive Committee (i.e. about 60 copies).

7. Publication Guidelines

- 7.1 If the Working Group task is directed to methodologies and techniques, publication as a *UNESCO Technical Papers in Marine Science* is appropriate and ensures wide distribution.
- 7.2 Where the task of the Working Group incorporates research, a "special issue" of a mainstream scientific journal is appropriate.
- 7.3 Where the task of the Working Group involves extensive review, then production of a reference text is appropriate.
- 8. For guidance on publications matters, Working Groups should work through the SCOR Publications Officer (see Executive Committee).
